Surface Design Association and Oregon College of Art and Craft to host *Crossing Generations: Past, Present & Future, SDA at 40* 

Surface Design Association (SDA) presents "Crossing Generations: Past, Present & Future", an exhibit curated by well-known gallerist and artist Jane Sauer to honor SDA's 40th Anniversary. The exhibit will be held at the Hoffman Gallery, Oregon College of Arts and Craft, July 10 - August 6, 2017, during SDA's "Making Our Mark Conference", which runs August 3-6, 2017.

In creating a vision for this exhibition, Sauer comments, "my desire is to highlight the work of the great mentors that laid the ground work for what is happening today, mid-career artists, and a look into what the future holds by showing the work of a few emerging artists."

A reception will take place 4-6pm, Saturday, August 5, during the conference. Their work covers a wide range of media and approaches and represents a small sampling of what is a rich history and future.

Jane Sauer's distinguished career includes being a full time artist and operating one of Santa Fe's most iconic fiber art galleries, the Jane Sauer Gallery. She is currently a freelance curator and consultant.

Surface Design Association will hold its biennial conference, *Making Our Mark: SDA at 40*, in Portland, Oregon, August 3-6, 2017. The conference focuses on past, present

and future with a lineup of speakers, panel discussions, demonstrations and exhibitions. Keynote speakers include Sheila Pepe, Josh Faught, Aram Han Sifuentes and Jane Lackey.
