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Surface Design Association presents its 4th Annual International Juried Members' Exhibition, *The Art of Labor* from July 22, 2018 - October 14, 2018 at the San Jose Museum of Quilts & Textiles (SJMQT), San Jose, CA.

The word *Labor* is used as a point of departure to encompass work that embodies or address all labor, physical *and* mental, from "slow fiber" to DIY processes. Fiber art is steeped in the traditions of material appreciation and labor, of the time involved in making art, and of the effort required in innovative manipulation or techniques. Associated with this process is the value and worth of skill, production, and time.

Jurors Amy DiPlacido and Carole Frances Lung selected 39 pieces by 31 SDA members. Over 540 artworks were submitted for consideration, representing 34 states and 7 countries including the US.

The opening reception for *The Art of Labor* took place July 22, 2018. Amy DiPlacido and Carole Frances Lung briefly discussed the exhibition and awarded prizes. An artist meet-and-greet took place during the reception.
