In 2018, SDA continued to pursue its mission of supporting contemporary fiber art and design with its quarterly Journal and national, regional and online exhibitions. In addition, SDA continued to strengthen infrastructure and secure a physical location for its archives at the University of Nebraska.

SDA JOURNAL

The Surface Design Journal assumed a fresh look in 2018, with new Editor Elizabeth Kozlowski, whose first issue premiered Spring 2018. Joined by Managing Editor Lauren Sinner and Art Director Michelle Silver, the Journal team continued to explore timely topics in contemporary fiber art, including *Pattern* (Spring, 2018); *The Art of Labor* (Summer, 2018); *Haptic: Tactile Sensations* (Fall, 2018) and *Family Matters, SDA's Annual Exhibition in Print*, (Winter, 2018) juried by Danielle Krsa (aka The Jealous Curator). New editorial departments included *In the Studio, Fiber in Film, Informed Voices & Curatorial Perspectives*. The changes have been well received.

PLANNING UNDERWAY FOR 2019

Planning is underway for SDA's next biennial conference, *Beyond the Surface*, to be held in October 2019 in St Louis, in conjunction with *Innovations in Textiles*. The Conference will also be the site of SDA's Annual Juried Member Exhibition (at St Louis Artists' Guild, a large contemporary art space by one of the oldest arts organizations west of the Mississippi River.) It will host *Future Tense 2019*, SDA's Annual Student Exhibition at the Edwardsville Art Center, and SDA's all member *Small Works* exhibition, at Webster University's Arcade Art Projects.

The membership survey reinforced SDA's commitment to print as well as digital delivery of the Journal to members. As SDA stabilized Journal and other costs, a membership dues increase only started to take effect in July, 2018. The results will be felt throughout the first renewal year, until June 2019. With board approval, SDA drew \$36,350 from organizational reserves to correct the budget shortfall. A balanced budget is achievable in 2019.

FUNDRAISING & CONTRIBUTED INCOME


- SDA gratefully acknowledges receiving a \$12,000 Leonore G. Tawney Grant to support the SDA Grants and Awards program.
- For the first time in four years, SDA raised the price of membership dues. With the challenges of increasing publications costs and lowered advertising revenue now also so prevalent in the national publications arena, the dues increase was paired with initiatives to grow membership.
- The Fundraising Committee established a Leadership Circle category of annual support at \$250 and above. It again launched an end of year Annual Appeal, this time focused on member stories along with donor matches. Contributed income in 2018 was \$30,623.22 from 135 donors, an increase of \$3941 over 2017.


OPERATIONS

October 2018 saw a leadership change, with Executive Director Danielle Kelly stepping down in order to assume another full time opportunity closer to home.

Nationally, the twin challenges of the current publications arena, affecting advertising, and lower engagement in member nonprofits are also true for SDA. During her three year tenure, along with Board assistance, Kelly oversaw a number critical improvements in infrastructure including:

- Journal redesign
- New website that separated out database administrative function, plus adoption of a new CRM database management system





- Staff job realignment, including editorial team
- Accounting functions placed with accountants external to the organization, with adoption of an SDA Internal Financial Controls document
- Increased donor giving and number of donors
- More robust exhibition schedule
- Establishing the SDA archives at University of Nebraska
- Increased committee and volunteer engagement
- Biennial member and lapsed member survey completed in first quarter 2018.

Karena Bennett, Advertising and Outreach Manager for SDA, was appointed Interim Executive Director, then full Executive Director in December. Bennett is a resident of Portland Oregon and brings a stellar resume with 13 years of arts administration with Portland area nonprofits. She writes, over the past year, I've seen SDA bring together artists, designers, educators, curators, students, gallerists, writers, and creative businesses. I'm thrilled to contribute to this remarkable community in an expanded capacity; it's truly a special opportunity for me to join my professional background with my personal passion for supporting creativity.

The SDA Board added the following new Directors in July: Michelle Lee and Andréa Banks, expanding its demographic reach and adding skill sets in fundraising and membership development.
